Abstract

Reliability and Validity of the Sinhala translation of the Lakaev Academic Stress Response Scale (LASRS-S)
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i. Objectives

The aim of the study was to translate Lakaev Academic Stress Response Scale (LASRS; Lakaev, 2006) to Sinhala and to establish LASRS as a valid and reliable measure of stress responses in Sinhalese university students.

ii. Design, setting and methods

The Sinhala version of LASRS was developed using the WHO translation methodology for health instruments; LASRS was translated into Sinhala, translation was reviewed by a bilingual panel, monolingual focus group, bilingual panel considered the monolingual review, back translation, original and back-translation considered by the bilingual group. The final translation was pilot tested. A cross-sectional study was designed with undergraduate freshmen of General Sir John Kotelawala Defence University (n=41) randomly selected from student registers. The mean age of the respondents was 20 and 83% were male. Internal consistency, concurrent and discriminant validity were examined. The known-groups method was performed with a group of university non-academics.

iii. Results

LASRS-S showed a strong internal consistency reliability with Cronbach α coefficient 0.894. Inter-item correlations for physiological, behavioural, cognitive and affective sub-scales were 0.271, 0.180, 0.451, 0.317 respectively. Each item correlated satisfactorily with the total score; corrected item total correlation values were positive and above 0.3. The correlation between physiological, behavioural, cognitive, and affective sub-scales were 0.590, 0.477, 0.904, 0.936 respectively. 91% of prediction was achieved to correctly discriminate the undergraduates and non-academics.

iv. Conclusions

The LASRS-S demonstrated good reliability and validity. Findings suggest application of LASRS-S as a proficient measure of academic stress responses in the Sinhalese university student population.
